Historical Context

• Since the birth of the United States, African-Americans were enslaved in the American South. During the mid-1800s many people known as abolitionists tried to bring an end to slavery. Their actions helped bring about the Civil War between Northern states and Southern slaveholding states. After the North was victorious and the Union saved, people in government known as Radical Republicans tried to "reconstruct" the south and expand the rights of African-Americans. Although the Radical Republicans were initially successful in transforming the South during the period of Reconstruction, in the long run, by 1900, they failed to change the region economically, politically, and socially.

SHARECROPPERS' CYCLE OF POVERTY

By the time sharecroppers had shared their crops and paid their debts, they rarely had any money left. A sharecropper became tied to one plantation, having to work until his debts were paid.

To pay debt, sharecropper promises landowner a greater share of next year's crop.



Sharecropper receives land and seed. In exchange, he promises landowner half the crop.

Sharecropper buys food and clothing on credit from landowner's store.





When settling up, landowner says that sharecropper owes more than he has earned. Sharecropper gives landowner crop to sell. Sharecropper gets half the earnings, minus his debt for the year.



Sharecropper plants and harvests crop.

What is sharecropping?

- Farmer rented land from landlord
 - Agreed to give landlord a portion of his crop at harvest time
 - Sold remaining crop
- Farmer also bought seed, tools, food, etc. on credit.
 - Paid off debt with remaining income
 - Cycle of poverty and debt
