

Pictograms (picture writing)

<u>Scribes</u> (trained writers) kept needed records.

Documents for tax collections, laws, and the storage of grain.




Cities

- Cities emerged as farmers produced surplus (extra) food.
- Agriculture (farming)
 population

Central Government

- ensured the food supply and protection.
- Bureaucracy is a system of managing gov't through departments run by officials



Religion

Ancient people were **polytheistic**, believing in many gods.

Cities had temples and priests to gain the favor of gods through rituals to ensure plentiful crops.

Job Specialization

People specialized in certain jobs.

Artisan- skilled craft worker














Art and Architecture
