
Aim: How should Hoover have responded to the Great Depression?



Impact of The Great Depression

- Farm Failures/Foreclosures
 - <u>Dust Bowl</u> droughts in Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas,
 Colorado, & New Mexico (The Grapes of Wrath by John Steinbeck)
- Unemployment hit 25%
- **Deflation** overall drop in prices
- Poverty and Hunger
 - Hoovervilles communities of unheated shacks built of cardboard, tin or crates
 - <u>Hoover Blankets</u> newspapers for people who slept on benches
- Business Failures
- Thousands of Bank Failures
- Stock Market Collapse



Hoover's Response

<u>Initially – rely on "Rugged Individualism"</u>

- "pull oneself up by the bootstraps"
- Economy would work itself out
- Encouraged private charities and local solutions

<u>Later – support to industry and agriculture</u>

- Reconstruction Finance Corporation (Trickle Down) provide financial aid to railroads, financial institutions,
 and business corporations.
- Some public works projects
- Protectionism (Hawley Smoot Tariffs)

Rejected the Following:

- Direct aid or relief to individuals
 - Responsibility of charities, local or state gov'ts

- Federal government owning any industry
 - Vetoed Muscle Shoals Bill (designed to build a dam in the Tennessee River and sell government-produced electricity)

- Senate rejected the bill to pay the bonus to vets.
- Herbert Hoover orders General MacArthur to clear out the veterans.
- MacArthur used miltarty force and tear gas against the veterans.
- Hoover lost support
