Homer


- Wrote epic poems the Iliad and the Odyssey
 - epic poems that describe the Trojan War, a conflict between the Greeks and the city of Troy that the epics say was fought almost 1200 years before the Common Era.
- <u>Iliad</u>
 - The story of the Trojan War & Achilles
- Odyssey
 - 10 years after the end of the Trojan War
 - Odysseus, a Greek soldier trying to find his way home to Ithaca

Helen of Troy

- Helen of Sparta
- Wife of King Menelaus
- Considered the most beautiful woman in the world



The Great Achilles

- Thetis: Sea Nymph Achilles mother
- River Styx: River of the underworld

 forms a border between the underworld and the world of the living.

The Odyssey

- Setting: 10 years after the end of the Trojan War
- Theme: A Long Journey
- A Hero In trouble:
 - Odysseus, a Greek soldier trying to find his way home to Ithaca
 - People of Ithaca have forgotten about him
 - His war-hero status is not important anymore
