 - Sauerkraut -> Liberty Cabbage



- New technologies:
 - Submarine, airplane, tank, poison gas, flame thrower
- Trench Warfare:
 - Soldiers fought each other from trenches huge loss of human life
- Human Cost: 9-11 million dead 21 million wounded
