First Amendment

- Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Enforcing Loyalty and Patriotism

- **Laws**

- Selective Service Act – men (21-30) must register for military service
- Espionage Act (1917) – illegal to interfere with the draft or recruitment of volunteers to serve in the military
- Sedition Act (1918) – prohibits speech that casts the government or the war effort in a negative light or interfered with the sale of government bonds

- **Schenck vs. United States** (1919)

- Upheld the Espionage Act
- Government can limit speech if it creates a “clear and present danger”

- **Propaganda** – using information to influence public opinion

- Enlistment – join the military
- War Bonds – loan the government money

- **Change in language**

- Hamburger -> Liberty Sandwich
- German Measles -> Liberty Measles
- Sauerkraut -> Liberty Cabbage
