 Harbor


• December 8 - United States declared war on Japan - President Roosevelt's Speech to Congress "A Date Which Will Live in Infamy?"




MOBILIZING PUBLIC OPINION

The Propaganda Campaign

Propaganda: ideas or information designed and spread to influence public opinion.





- Rationing Every American was issued ration books with removable stamps good for items, like sugar, meat, cooking oil, and canned goods.
- <u>Factories</u> converted for war production
- Income Tax highest in American History
- War Bonds borrowed \$ deficit spending







 - The Women's Army Corps (WAC)





IMPACT OF WAR ON AFRICAN AMERICANS


• African-Americans

- Executive order prohibiting discrimination by defense contractors
- Resumption of Great Migration
- Military still segregated
- Many questioned hypocrisy of fighting war against racism abroad while discrimination existed at home






Figure 5: National Defense Outlays, FY1910-2007

WARTIME CONFERENCES

- Teheran (Nov. 1943)
- Yalta (Feb. 1945)
 - Free Elections in Eastern Europe
 - Division of Germany and Berlin
 - Russia agrees to enter war against Japan 3 months after German Surrender
 - Russia receives land lost in Russo-Japanese War and concessions in Manchuria
 - Agree to establish a UN
- Potsdam (July, 1945)
 - Unconditional surrender of Japan
 - (A-bomb successfully tested during conference)
